August is Back-to-School Time

It's that time of year - Back-to-School time! The time of year that parents look forward to and children dread! Help to make this school year accident and injury free with these helpful tips from the Consumer Products Safety Commission, the American Academy of Pediatrics and Estero Fire Rescue:

Traveling to and from school can pose special concerns, especially for young children. Review safety tips with your children for their transportation to make sure that they have a happy and safe school year.

School Bus

- Wait for the bus to stop before approaching it from the curb.
- Do not move around on the bus.
- Check to see that no other traffic is coming • before crossing.
- Make sure to always remain in clear view of the bus driver.

Car

- All passengers should wear a seat belt and/or • an age- and size-appropriate car safety seat or booster seat.
- Your child should ride in a car safety seat with a harness as long as possible and then ride in a belt-positioning booster seat. Your child is ready for a booster seat when she has reached the top weight or height allowed for her seat, her shoulders are above the top harness slots, or her ears have reached the top of the seat.
- Your child should ride in a belt-positioning booster seat until the vehicle's seat belt fits properly (usually when the child reaches about 4' 9" in height and is between 8 to 12 years of age). This means the shoulder belt lies across the middle of the chest and shoulder, not the neck or throat; the lap belt is low and snug across the thighs, not the stomach; and the child is tall enough to sit against the vehicle seat back with her legs bent at the knees and feet hanging down.

- All children under 13 years of age should ride in the rear seat of vehicles.
- Remember that many crashes occur while novice teen drivers are going to and from school. You may want to limit the number of teen passengers to prevent driver distraction. Do not allow your teen to drive while eating, drinking, or talking on a cell phone.

Bike

- Always wear a bicycle helmet, no matter how short or long the ride.
- Ride on the right, in the same direction as auto traffic.
- Use appropriate hand signals.
- Respect traffic lights and stop signs.
- Wear bright color clothing to increase visibility.

Walking to School

- Make sure your child's walk to a school is a safe route with well-trained adult crossing guards at every intersection.
- Be realistic about your child's pedestrian skills. Because small children are impulsive and less cautious around traffic, carefully consider whether or not your child is ready to walk to school without adult supervision.
- Bright colored clothing will make your child more visible to drivers.

Estero encompasses some 35 gated communities, and is home to the Coconut Point Mall, Miromar Outlet Mall, the Estero Community Park and the Koreshan Historic Site. It is adjacent to the Florida Gulf Coast University and the Southwest Florida International Airport.

The Estero Feasibility Study demonstrated that the Estero tax revenue for the first 5 years of incorporation will be \$41 million with expenses of \$26 million, leaving a surplus of \$15 million. According to the Lee County Community Development's Planning Department, in 2014 there were 29,632 permanent residents, rising to 42,562 in season. Of those, 23,680 are registered

The Village of Estero also is home to the Estero Concert Series, chamber music concerts performed by accomplished classical artists in the Koreshan Historic Site's 100 year-old Art Hall.







In Memoriam





Here we are mid-summer already! Rain and Heat...a normal Florida summer. Real Estate sales in Fountain Lakes remain strong, with prices on the upswing! I have seen more Hertz employees than previous months. Hertz announced yesterday that by Halloween, the first wave of employees from the Bonita facility will move to Estero. Thru November, 180 employees will make the move to Estero every weekend. By Thanksgiving, all operations will be consolidated in the 300,000 sq ft building at Williams and 41.
