

Letter from Ed Schreiner President, Fountain Lakes Community Association

I thought it might be helpful to use this column to summarize some decisions that have been reached by the Board of Governors at our November 18th meeting.

We have been approached about the desire to allow swing sets in people's yards. The impetus for this is that we are experiencing a changing demographic and are seeing more young families buying homes in Fountain Lakes and these families would like to be able to put a swing set on their property. The issue is that our current covenants do not permit the erection of any temporary structures on owners' lots. The Board of Governors can't simply decide to allow it when the documents forbid it. So, we agreed to place a proposed document change in the upcoming 2016 election package so that we aren't incurring incremental expense for a mass mailing. If 51% of voters approve it, we then can work on an implementation plan with detailed descriptions of what will (or will not) be allowed.

The Board also decided to put some teeth in our directions to homeowners regarding the disposal of horticultural waste. Our letters to violating owners have not yielded compliance so we will now have the ability to levy fines for violations. Just to be clear, horticultural waste (lawn clippings, palm fronds etc.) cannot be placed in front of your home prior to Friday noon. This was negotiated with Lee County in order to give our residents more flexibility for disposal. However, we continue to see this debris stacked in front of some homes all week which detracts from the curb appeal we all strive to achieve. Therefore, going forward, the Master Association will have the ability to fine homeowners that do not comply. Failure to pay the fines can lead to foreclosure if allowed to accumulate, but we certainly hope it never gets to that. Further, when the waste is put out, it cannot interfere with storm drains or pedestrian walkways and must be wholly contained on the homeowner's property.

The Board has adopted a resolution that, going forward, golf carts can only be driven by residents aged 16 or older. We have witnessed some near calamities with younger drivers careening around the roads here with multiple kids on the cart, some hanging off the sides and back of the cart. In more than one instance we have seen kids falling off the golf cart when the driver goes around a corner too fast. This is a nasty accident waiting to happen and we want to avoid the injuries that are sure to happen if we don't take action. Our security company, Statewide Security, will enforce this for us.

If there has been one hot-button issue that has gained a lot of intensity lately, it's the question of how to control the rental of properties in our community. Just about every Local Association's documents start out with the line: "In order to foster a stable residential community and prevent a motel like atmosphere....". Yet we continually get complaints

Tips to enjoy your Holiday Season Safety

The long holiday season is full of opportunities or those with loose connections. Outside, use lighting for people to get together for fun, food, and sharing. By following some simple precautions, you can make the holidays safe for yourself, your family and friends.

Be watchful of dangers to children. Teach them to stay away from candles, fireplaces, fireworks, space heaters, matches, and lighters. Holly and mistletoe can be and placed away from all exits and sources of heat. All poisonous to small children and pets.

Choose toys wisely. Pass up those that could be highly flammable or a choking hazard. Make sure electric toys are labeled for fire safety, and keep them away from your before you light them. Do not use them in decorations tree. Be sure to check for toys that may be recalled by the manufacturer

Install smoke alarms on every level in your home and in each bedroom. Check their function according to manufacturer's directions, and change their batteries at least once a year. It could mean the difference between waking up to a small, smoldering fire or one you can't escape. For the greatest fire safety, we recommend a smoke alarm inside each bedroom in addition to the required smoke alarm on each level of the home.

Wrap it up! Dispose of gift wrappings soon after opening presents. A room full of paper lying around on the floor and furniture is yet another holiday hazard. Do not burn wrappings in a fireplace; they may ignite suddenly and cause a flash fire

<u>Check out lights</u>. Make sure all holiday lights are tested for safety. You can identify these by a "UL" label from Underwriters Laboratories. Replace any worn sets

labeled for outdoor use. Inside, do not overload outlets. Never put lights on a metal tree. And always unplug everything before you leave your home or go to bed. <u>Choose a fresh tree.</u> Look for one without shedding needles. Trim the trunk at an angle before you put it in a non-tip stand. Make sure it is watered constantly artificial trees should have labels which indicate they are fire retardant.

Care with candles. Always put candles in candlesticks or displays. Keep candles away from curtains or other combustibles materials. Never put them in windows or near exits. And never leave candles in the reach of unsupervised children or pets. Always blow out candles when you leave a room.

Have a fire safe fireplace. Have it professionally inspected at least once a year and cleaned if necessary. Don't burn anything but dry wood, as paper can fly out of the chimney. Have a spark arrester installed on top of the chimney to cut hazards. Use a metal fire screen, put ashes in metal containers and never store them in your home.
