

Letter from Ed Schreiner President, Fountain Lakes Community Association

We're now at the beginning of "Season" so I thought it might be helpful to reiterate some of the issues that we get involved in and then talk about what we can/will do about them.

We continue to get calls frequently about yard waste at the front of properties early in the week. Just so you know, we have negotiated with Lee County to allow yard waste to be put out at the street no earlier than Friday noon for pickup on Monday. When it is put out at the street, it must not be put on top of storm drains for obvious reasons, and also cannot protrude into the street. Lee County does drivethroughs and will ticket households that have waste out at the street prior to Friday noon. Please advise your yard maintenance contractors of the rules so you don't have to deal with the negative consequences. No one wants to look at your yard waste all week long when we work so hard to keep our community neat and clean. In addition, yard waste must be bundled or it won't be picked up.

As you know, we continually wrestle with gate issues at both of our entrances. We continue to work with the Fire Department on a solution to the cross-over issue at the Williams Road gate and have several alternatives in mind that must be approved by Estero Fire Rescue. At the US41 entrance we are close to completion of the BOG- approved plan to have the gates closed 24 hours a day, but open on approach from 6 AM to 8 PM. Outside of those hours the gates will be locked down and require a remote, a barcode or a digital code for the key pad. Stop by the office, if you have questions about any of the three options. We have had great success with the new bar code feature. So far nearly 200 residents have opted to have the barcode installed on their cars. If you have questions or interest in the new barcode feature, stop by the office and we'll be happy to discuss.

It is probably time to review again the agreement reached between the Presidents' Council and the Board of Governors several years ago that stated that the BOG would not interfere in the governance of the local Associations unless they were specifically asked to intervene by the local Association Board. The Presidents of your Associations were unanimous in their conviction that they wanted the chance to address issues in their communities first and then reserve the right to petition the BOG for help if necessary. The charter of the Master Association Board of Governors is to govern and maintain the headquarters area, both entrances and the roads inside the community. Any issues with yards, driveways, paint jobs etc. are to be dealt with by the local association first. This has worked well since its inception and the plan is to continue with that agreement.


