

## "Covenant Coaching"

For the benefit of our newer residents and a refresher for those folks who have been busy with life in "Paradise" and may appreciate a reminder.

Compliance with Documents. Each Owner and any other individual within Fountain Lakes shall be bound and abide by the Fountain Lakes Declarations, Covenants, and rules. The conduct of any individual shall be considered the conduct of the owner responsible for such individual's presence within Fountain Lakes. Such owner shall be liable to the Corporation and/or the Neighborhood Association for the cost of any maintenance, repair, damage, insurance cost or deductible or copay, or replacement of any real or personal property located on the Corporate Common Areas rendered necessary by his or her act, neglect, carelessness which shall be paid by the Owner as an individual expense Assessment. Failure of the Owner to notify their invitees or lessees shall not serve as a defense to enforcement or liability of the Owner and Owner shall remain responsible for their quests, invitees, delagatees, lessees, tenants, at all times.

#### **Emails Save Your HOA Money**

Because so many people in Fountain Lakes still have not provided their email addresses to the office a lot of wasted money is spent on snail mail. Over 95% of residents have an email address but we have just over half of them recorded

It costs a lot of money to prepare, print and mail letters these days! In Sunrise alone it will cost over \$2000.00 in 2020 to mail the residents who have not provided us with email addresses. Such a waste of paper, chemicals, time, and your money! When emails are sent to you by the Master Board or your Community Board, no other residents can see your email address so you don't have to worry that your email address is being spread around. The email is done by BCC (Blind carbon copy)or by a specialized program, neither of which show email addresses to all the recipients of the message. Confirm with the office to make sure they have your email address, and check that your neighbours and friends have done this too. Save a tree, give us your email.

Our property stays in our possession. Criminals get nothing! The following are simple ways to secure your property. Residential Safety – How to Deter Thieves Your Home: ~ Take a walk around your home (LCSO offers residential security surveys) ~ Illuminate dark areas with motionactivated lights ~ Keep shrubs and trees trimmed ~ Close garage doors ~ Secure sliding doors with auxiliary locks or pins ~ Lock your doors and windows - always ~ Use deadbolt locks, solid doors, sturdy hinges and peepholes ~ Reinforce strike plates on doors with 3-inch screws ~ Use film on glass doors or windows near doors (consider floor locks) ~ Install and use alarms and/or cameras – advertise security ~ Keep blinds/drapes closed at night and open during the day ~ Keep a light on inside at night (use timers while away) (tvs on timers) ~ Never open your door to strangers or allow strangers inside ~ Be cautious of salespeople and service people ~ Never hide

## Owners Beware of Native Species in Southwest Florida:

Alligators, Rattle Snakes, Panthers, Bobcats, Wild Hogs, Racoons, and Coyotes have all been seen at times in Fountain Lakes. We know our lakes currently have alligators so stay clear of the shoreline and water. Bears are also common in our area but I have not heard of a sighting in Fountain Lakes. Beware of the Cane Toad, which is an invasive species and very poisonous to pets. As more land is developed, we push these creatures into a smaller habitat. Please be aware of your surroundings as you travel around the community. Especially watch out for your pets! Please warn your family and any guests or renters of the possible danger when they are visiting. Let's all stay safe.

## Protect Yourself From 'Distraction Burglaries' - Be Alert!

The Lee County Sheriff's Office reminds you to protect yourself from distraction burglary - defined as: "Any crime where a falsehood, trick or distraction is used on an occupant of a dwelling to gain, or try to gain, access to the premises in order to commit burglary."

Victims tend to find they have had money and/or valuables stolen only after the offense has actually been committed. These criminals are often highly organized, they can work alone or in pairs, and operate under an array of guises, including utility company personnel, door-to-door salespeople, builders and landscapers. In most cases legitimate workers will carry ID and relevant paperwork. Most will wait patiently and be willing to answer any questions about their visit. It is also good practice among many companies to make an appointment beforehand, rather than turning up at your door unannounced.

Preventing distraction burglary - When someone knocks at the door, stop and think: Are you expecting anyone? Always ask for an

ID or any associated paperwork. If you have any doubt you should call the company. Ensure your back door is always closed when answering the front door. Criminals intent on gaining access to your property may be working in pairs - while one distracts you at your front door the other may be trying to enter your property via the back. Never keep large sums of money in the house. Keep valuables and items of sentimental value where they are not easily accessible - the use of a small safe might be appropriate. Keep documents containing personal details out of sight, e.g. passport, utility bills, bank statements etc. Keep your keys in a safe place and not on display.

#### Call law enforcement:

If you are suspicious or feel that the caller may be bogus. If someone forces entry or enters your home without permission. If you notice valuables or money have gone missing shortly after someone has visited.

Whenever you think a crime has been, or is about to be, committed.

#### Fraudulent Credit Card Alerts

Consumers need to be alert to a recent text scam that advises them a credit card account is restricted and requires that they call to remove the restriction. Upon calling the number provided, scammers make attempts to obtain the following information: Date of Birth, Social Security Number, Mother's Maiden Name, Card Account Number, Expiration Date, 3 Digit Security Code. Credit card companies would not ask for this information when you contact them in response to a text alert. If you receive a suspicious communication about your credit card, you should call the number on the back of your card to verify that it is legitimate. If you think you may be a victim of a scam or that your personal information was compromised, you can place a fraud alert on your credit bureau by contacting one of the three major credit reporting agencies, and change your passwords (Experian: 1-888-397-3742; TransUnion: 1-800-916-8800; Equifax: 1-800-685-1111).

#### How Often Does Estero Fire Rescue come to Fountain Lakes

Ever wonder how much we use the fire rescue services in Estero?

There was 1 Building Fire, 105 Emergency Medical Incidents, 15 Calls for public service, 7 Good intent calls, 2 False alarms for a total of 132 calls from Estero Fire Rescue to the Fountain Lake Community in 2019.

## Special Services Especially Good for Seniors

Estero Fire Rescue is proud to assist any resident, regardless of age, with changing out their smoke alarms and/or batteries. (smoke alarms have a life of 7 years so if it has been more than seven years or you are not sure how long you have had your units, it may be time to change them out). You will need to purchase the batteries (long-life also known as ten-year batteries) or the smoke alarm(s) units (must be type with a sealed, long life battery) prior to our arrival. Once you have these items, contact our office at 239-390-8000 to schedule your appointment. This is a free service and no donation is expected.
